Post Construction Cleaning

What is Post Construction Cleaning?

Thoroughly cleaning and removing construction debris, dust and other materials left behind after a construction or renovation project. This guarantees that the constructed or remodeled area is pristine, clean and ready for the doors to open!

Post Construction cleaning involves three phases:

Rough clean: This initial phase removes large debris, trash, and excess materials.

- Dispose of construction materials such as wood scraps, nails, screws, and drywall pieces
- Remove protective coverings, tape, and plastic sheeting from surfaces
 - Collect and dispose of any leftover paint cans, buckets, and tools
 - Debris and Trash Removal

Detail clean: During this phase, the space is meticulously cleaned, including surfaces, fixtures, and appliances.

- Wipe down all hard surfaces, including countertops, cabinets, and shelves
 - Clean windowsills, door frames, and baseboards
- Remove any stickers or labels from windows and glass surfaces
 - Wipe down window frames and tracks
 - Appliance and Fixture Cleaning
- Remove protective coverings and packaging from new appliances
- Wipe down and sanitize the exteriors and interiors of appliances, such as ovens, refrigerators, and dishwashers
 - Dust and clean light fixtures, switches, and outlets

Final clean: The last phase ensures the area is spotless and ready for occupancy or inspection.

- Dust all surfaces, including walls, ceilings, light fixtures, and vents
 - Vacuum carpets thoroughly to remove fine dust and debris
 - Surface Cleaning
 - Window and Glass Cleaning
- Clean windows, mirrors, and glass partitions using a squeegee and glass cleaner
 - Sweep and mop hard floors, such as tile, hardwood, or laminate
 - Polish and buff tile or stone floors if needed
 - Bathroom and Kitchen Cleaning
- Clean and sanitize all fixtures, including sinks, toilets, tubs, and showers
 - Wipe down and disinfect countertops, backsplashes, and cabinets
 - Clean and polish faucets, handles, and other hardware
